

Funeral Set For Victim of Gunshot. At American Fork

Funeral services for Mrs. Frieda Rleske Parker, 41, wife of Ross Parker of American Fork, who was found dead in her bed Thursday morning, from what Utah county peace officers believe was a self-inflicted bullet wound, will be held Monday at 1 p. m. in the American Fork Third ward chapel.

County Attorney W. Stanley Dunford declared Saturday morning, after a careful investigation of the details surrounding the death of Mrs. Parker, that all evidence indicated the wound was self-inflicted. He declared that the only finger prints found on the gun were those of Mrs. Parker.

Mrs. Parker was found dead by her husband when he went to call her for breakfast.

Mrs. Parker was born in Provo, February 8, 1894, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Rleske. Following her marriage on June 4, 1919, she moved to American Fork where she has lived since.

She is survived by her husband, parents and six brothers, William O. Rleske, Coffeyville, Kansas; Alvin R., Texarkana, Texas; Oswald, Daniel, Max and Arnold of Provo and one sister, Mrs. Ray Ewell of Nephi.

Friends may view the body at the Anderson Brother mortuary Sunday afternoon and evening and at the family home Monday morning prior to the services. Interment will be in the Provo cemetery.
