Albert Charles Weigel, 76, of 5916 Shore Acre Drive died yesterday at Manatee Memorial Hospital. A native of Knoxville, Tenn., he came to Bradenton in 1953 from East Orange, N. J. following his retirement as vice president of Combustion Engineering Super Heat, Inc.

A 1908 graduate of the University of Tennessee, Mr. Weigel was first employed with Walsh and Weidner Boiler Co., becoming a vice president and director in 1920. He held this position until 1928 when he joined Combustion Engineers. In 1940 he was made a vice president and served in that capacity until his retirement.

Mr. Weigel was a fellow of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, a member of the American Boiler Manufacturers Association, past president of American Welding Society, past president of American Society of Metals; member of Newcomen Society, Society of Naval Architects and Marine Engineers and was listed in "Who's Who in America and Europe in Engineering" and in "Who's Who in America."

Mr. Weigel was also a member of Palma Sola Presbyterian Church, Braidentown Lodge 99 F & AM, Knights Templar, Egypt Temple Shrine, Manatee County Shrine and Bradenton Exchange Club.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Ethel M. Weigel; two sons, Albert S. Weigel of Simsbury, Conn. and John Henry Weigel of Chattanooga, Tenn.; three brothers, C. W. Weigel of Chattanooga, Rothe Weigel of Chicago and Fred Weigel of Cleveland, Ohio; a sister, Miss Anna Weigel of Knoxville; and six grandchildren.
