

Lindon Woman Dies of Fall Injuries

Lifelong County
Resident
Succumbs at 80

LINDON—Mrs. Sarah Jane Holman Walker, 80, lifelong resident of Utah county, died Monday at 4:10 p. m. at the home of a daughter, Mrs. Lester G. West of Lindon, of complications following a hip fracture suffered in a fall two weeks ago at the West home.

Prior to her accident she had been living with another daughter, Mrs. Jennie W. Johnson of Orem.

Mrs. Walker, who had resided 58 years at her home in Lindon, was noted for her ministrations to the ill before the days of doctors and for her L. D. S. church and educational leadership in more recent years. She was the widow of Appollos Benjamin Walker, who died in 1910.

Six of her eight children became school teachers, partly because of their mother's interest in education. Among them was the late James H. Walker, first principal of Pleasant Grove high school and former district superintendent.

She was born June 13, 1858, in Santaquin, a daughter of James Alonzo and Sarah Ann Mathis Holman, pioneers of 1847 and members of the first two families to enter Utah county. She was married to Mr. Walker April 24, 1876, in the old L. D. S. Endowment house in Salt Lake City and had lived here continuously since.

Surviving are three sons, Benjamin and Lawrence R. Walker of Lindon and Jesse M. Walker of American Fork; two daughters, Mrs. West of Lindon and Mrs. Johnson of Orem, and one foster-daughter, Mrs. Evelyn Strong of Alpine; 59 grandchildren and 40 great-grandchildren; five brothers, Warren, Parley and Ray Holman, all of Fountain Green; James I. Holman of Brigham City, and Robert Holman of Bear River City, and two sisters, Mrs. Naomi Huggins of Bear River City and Mrs. Nancy Low of Beaver.

Funeral services will be conducted Thursday at 2 p. m. in the Timpanogos L. D. S. stake tabernacle by Bishop Leonard S. Walker of the Lindon ward. Burial will be in Pleasant Grove cemetery.

Fall Is Fatal To Woman, 80

PLEASANT GROVE, May 23.—Mrs. Sarah Jane Holman Walker, 80, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Lester West of Lindon Monday. After a two week's illness which was the result of a fall in which she fractured a hip.

She was born in Santaquin June 13, 1858, a daughter of James and Sarah Ann Mathis Holman. She married Appollos Benjamin Walker in the Salt Lake Endowment House April 24, 1876. He died Feb. 3, 1910.

Mrs. Walker was active in most of the Church organizations, holding office in each at one time or another. In later years she traveled much with her son, the late James H. Walker.

She was the mother of seven children and one adopted daughter. Five of the children have been teachers in the Alpine School District. These are: Benjamin Walker, Mrs. Margaret W. West and Laurence R. Walker, Lindon; Mrs. Jennie W. Johnson, Orem; Jesse M. Walker, principal of the American Fork High School; Mrs. Evelyn Iverson Strong, Alpine.

Two sons, prominent educators, James H. and Robert Walker, have died in the past three years.

There are 59 grandchildren and 40 great-grandchildren, and the following brothers and sisters: James I. Holman, Brigham City; Warren, Parley and Ray Holman, Fountain Green; Robert Holman and Mrs. Naomi Huggins, Bear River City; Mrs. Nancy Low, Beaver City.

Funeral services will be held in the Timpanogos Stake Tabernacle at Pleasant Grove, Thursday at 2 p. m. with Bishop Leonard S. Walker in charge.
