

JOSHUA PARSHALL TERRY

Joshua Parshall Terry was born 3 April 1860 in Draper, Salt Lake County, Utah. He died 6 December 1941 in Salt Lake City. He is buried in Mt Olivet Cemetery, SLC.

Joshua Parshall received his early education from Dr. John R. Park at Draper, UT. He attended the University of Utah, graduating in 1881. He taught school in the various towns of the state for fifteen years and was a principal of Pleasant Grove School for five years.

He married Amelia Charles on 12 January 1882, whom he met at Union school.

He sang in the Tabernacle Choir when Evan Stephens was the choir director. He was choir leader in the Draper Ward. He belonged to the John Smith Camp of Sons of Utah Pioneers. He worked as a salesman and had a farm, growing good fruit. He was a great lover of flowers and had a beautiful flower garden wherever he lived. They moved to Salt Lake City in 1918.

After the death of Amelia in 1930, he married Mrs. George Holdaway, who passed away 16 July 1935 then he married Mrs. Ella Johnson.
