FUNERAL OF J. RUBEL HELD HERE FRIDAY

Jacob Rubel was born in Germany in 1839, and passed away at his home in Maynard, Minn., on December 19, 1916, at the ripe old age of 77 years, and 7 months.

Mr. Rubel came to this country when twenty-eight years of age and settled in Illinois, where in 1871 he was united in marriage to Mattie Schrader. Nine children were born to them, all of whom with the mother survive. They are: John of Dalton Minn., George of Laurens, Fred, Henry, Martha, and Mrs. J. Marholz of Maynard, Minn., Mrs. E.L. Stoullil of Pocahontas, Jacob of Emmetsburg, and Mrs. C.C. Cole of this place. He is also survived by one brother, Peter, who resides at Hamlin, Iowa.

In 1898 the family moved to a farm two miles south of Havelock, where they resided for two years, moving then to Mallard. There the family resided until the year of 1909 when they moved to Minnesota.

Mr. Rubel's death came after a brief illness, and his sudden demise was a great shock to the relatives and the many friends.

Early in life, Mr. Rubel became a member of the German Lutheran church, and was close follower of its teachings until death.

The remains were brought to this place last Friday, and laid to rest in Washington cemetery. The funeral was conducted by Rev. Leazer, at the M. E. church.
