Addie Mae Gurr Edwards, 92, of Orem, died Thursday, Nov. 30, 1989, at the American Fork Hospital.

She was born March 7, 1897, in Salt Lake City, the ninth child of 13 and a daughter of Ruben L. and Margaret Marsh Gurr. She married Philo T. Edwards Sept. 19, 1917 in the Manti LDS Temple.

At age 2 she moved with her family to Colonia Pacheco, Mexico. She graduated from the eighth grade as the valedictorian of her class. Her family was driven out of Mexico in the Mormon exodus of 1912, and she settled in Buckhorn, Utah, where she met her future husband at an MIA activity.

She was one of BYU's most faithful football



fans in supporting her son, Coach LaVell Edwards.

She was an active member of the LDS Church and has served in several positions as well as an ordinance worker at the Provo LDS Temple.
