His employers offered him any increase in salary if he would stay, but his mind was made up to come to "Zion." They left Birdwell, Yorkshire, England, and came on the ship "Corsican", arriving in Winter Quarters, Carbon County, Utah in November 1912. The trip taking eleven days on the water and four days on the train. They came in company with Rudger Clawson (last name unclear typing). Their first home in Utah was made of lumber, kerosene lamps were used for lighting, and coal was used for fuel.

Even after coming to America, his old employers offered to pay the expenses of all the family, give him a considerable raise in salary, as well as build him a new home, if he would return to England. All these things, however, were not sufficient to induce [induce] him to return.

Harry and Eliza Quilter have 10 children, 39 grandchildren, and 8 great-grandchildren. They came to Henrieville in the early fall of 1913.
