

HISTORY OF THE LIFE OF VICTOR ALMA BURGNER

Victor Alma Burgener was born to Alma Andrew and Lena Durtschi Burgener on March 10, 1910 in a small log cabin situated on the family farm in Midview, Utah. Victor was the second child of eleven in the family of Alma and Lena, but was the first to survive beyond birth. His sister, Elisabeth had been born on September 29, 1908, but died the same day. His birth was followed by Hulda on January 4, 1912, Leona on November 25, 1914, Lavina on October 25, 1916, Esther on November 18, 1918, Albert on October 15, 1920, Ray (Stillborn) on February 10, 1922, Randolph on October 29, 1924 (he died on November 16, 1924), Sylvia on July 15, 1925 (she died the same day), and Marjorie on November 15, 1927. Alma and Lena lived in Midview, a small town east of Bridgeland and northwest of Myton in Duchesne County, Utah, but a larger part of the extended family lived in Midway, Utah a small town in Wasatch County, to which Alma's father, Andreas Burgener, and Lena's father, Friedrich Durtschi had immigrated from Switzerland. Lena's father later settled south of Midway in Stringtown.

It was following a visit by Lena to see her father in Midway about 1915 with her children, Victor, Hulda, and Leona that a near tragedy happened to Victor. Returning from Midway to Midview in the fall of the year, Lena's brother, Alfred Durtschi was driving the team and hay-laden wagon up Daniels Canyon east of Heber City with Lena sitting on the seat holding Leona who was just an infant, and Victor and Hulda riding atop the load of hay. The horses apparently slipped or stumbled causing the wagon to slide over an embankment and land upside down in the creek. Hulda was thrown somewhat clear of the load and was easily reached and comforted. Victor, however, was pinned beneath the load in the creek. After some time and effort, Victor, who was unconscious when he was found, was pulled free, revived and taken by horseback to a camp near the top of the canyon where they all spent the night, drying their clothes. After returning to Midway to get help, the trip continued without further problems.

Victor spent his boyhood years on the farm which consisted of 160 acres plus two 40 acre Indian leases. His father, Alma, served as Branch President of the Arcadia and Antelope Branches of the Church, Bishop of the Midview Ward for 15 years, and also served for a few years as the Midview Postmaster. Therefore, Victor learned hard work as a boy and assumed a great deal of the responsibility of caring for the animals and in planting, irrigating and harvesting the crops. They raised alfalfa and alfalfa seed, sugar cane, potatoes, peanuts, wheat, barley, clover, and oats; had two to six cows, several horses, a herd of sheep, turkeys and chickens. They churned their own butter, and as might be expected of those with a strong Swiss heritage, made cheese. Separating the cream from the milk they sold it to Nelson Ricks Creamery in Salt Lake City to help provide income.

In 1922 the family moved out of the log cabin into a new home his father had built on North Hill which overlooked the farm below. It was about this time, at age 12, that Victor learned to drive a car around the farm. The first car the family had was a 1917 Studebaker "Big 6", but Victor learned to drive in a 1918 Model T Ford. When his father developed back troubles and was unable to work the farm, Victor was forced to drop out of school in the 9th grade to take over many of the responsibilities of working the farm. He related how he harvested a patch of potatoes near the house which produced a bumper crop and surprised his father, both with the fact that the work was done, as well as with the size of the harvest. But Victor had other interests and opportunities besides the work of farming. He recalled how as a young boy he made a kite and flew it from a hilltop near his home. He was proud of how it flew as far as the string would allow, which was a great distance as he had a very long string. As a youth he fished in the streams and nearby Duchesne River. He was also an active member of the Boy Scouts of America and attained several merit badges and the rank of Life Scout.

He attended the Midview Elementary School, a one room school which was about a mile from his house, and in the 9th grade started attending Duchesne County High School in Roosevelt. It was during this year of high school that he was forced to drop out and help his father on the farm. The following year, in September, 1925, he went to Midway, Utah to live with his Aunt Lena Zenger, his father's sister, so he could take his freshman year of high school over again at Wasatch High School in Heber City. While there, he also attended the Wasatch Stake Seminary which was across the street from the high school. He and his cousin Ray Zenger were almost the same age so the two of them attended classes together, went to church together, participated in their Aaronic Priesthood duties together, and shared many other experiences associated with boys of fifteen. Since the Zenger home was too small to accomodate the extra family member, and since his grandfather, Andreas, who had been widowed earlier that year lived next door on the corner of First North and First West in Midway, both Victor and Ray moved in with him for the school year. They relished the stories retold to them by their grandfather of his life and associations in Switzerland prior to immigrating to this country. But, even there in Midway, Victor carried his load by working on his Uncle Henry Zenger's farm with Ray. They had morning and evening chores attending to the livestock and other animals to assist his uncle who was partially disabled with a shoulder injury. In the Fall of that year they would take the cows to their grandfather's old farm west of town and while the cows grazed, they would pick apples, pears, prunes and plums and store them in the basement of the old farmhouse so they could sell them during the winter in Midway and Heber City. Their transportation to and from school in Heber City was by a large horse-drawn covered wagon with seats down each side. If they were detained after school and missed the wagon home, they

would have to walk the four miles to Midway, but often were able to hitch a ride on other wagons going in that direction. But it was not always work and no play. On Friday evenings the youth of the area would assemble at the Zenger home and then go across the street to the city park and playground of the Midway Elementary School to play games such as kick-the-can, run-sheep-run and various other games we likely can remember from our youth, as well.

The following year, 1926, Victor was at home in Midview again and again attending Duchesne County High School for his Sophomore, Junior, and Senior years. It was during this period of his life that he participated on the high school track team. He ran the 440 yard and the mile races, but excelled in the pole vault. During a track meet in Price, Utah he claimed third place in the races and received a blue ribbon for the pole vault. His physical conditioning through sports participation and hard work on the farm contributed to a long, healthful, and active life, and were evident in activities he undertook in his thirties, forties, and fifties. In 1968 at age 58 Victor took up the sport of golf with great zest and vigor. He golfed in the Granite School District golf tournaments and won several trophies. On the par 3, #8 hole at Forest Dale Golf course one day, Victor drove his tee shot into the cup for a hole-in-one which was one of the highlights of his sports career, and got his name in the newspaper in recognition of the event.

During his Senior year, he had the responsibility of driving the school bus between Midview and Roosevelt each day. He had many stories to tell of this experience, one of which was that during a heavy rainstorm late one afternoon, he was driving back to Midview over some very muddy roads when the bus became hard to handle and came to a stop. He got out to look for the trouble and found mud had accumulated in the wheel wells and around the tires to the point where it was impossible for the tires to rotate, or for the front wheels to steer. He had to walk some distance to another bus route and ask that driver to come over and take the remaining students home while he and the bus owner cleaned the mud out so the bus could be moved.

Over the years, the family farm developed soil problems. Alkali deposits and leechings soured the soil and rendered the ground unable to produce crops. The government finally acquired the property on which they built a reservoir, and in December of 1929 when Victor was 19, the family left the old homestead and moved to Salt Lake City. The travel to Salt Lake City was a little easier than travel had been in previous years since the family now had a 1925 Studebaker which they had acquired in trade for some sheep. Victor's father built a home for the family at 949 East 33rd South and he and Lena lived there for the rest of their lives. Victor's youngest sister, Marjorie, still lives there at this time.

The move to Salt Lake City brought major changes in Victor's life. The ward into which they had moved was the Hillcrest Ward. Not too long before the Burgener's arrived in the ward, the Gustav Dickman family moved into the northern part of the ward at 946 Hudson Avenue. As fate would have it, the Dickman's had a daughter the same age as Victor and it didn't take long for them to notice each other. On March 13, 1931, Victor bought the engagement ring, and on October 14, 1931, Victor Alma Burgener and Bertha Irene Dickman were married in the Salt Lake Temple. The two of them lived, at first, with Victor's father on 33rd South because of the depression which was in it's depths at this time. At this time Victor worked for the Utoco station on the corner of 9th East and 33rd South, about a half block from home. It was also about this time that Victor bought his first car which he kept at the service station for a while so his Dad would not know about it. Not long after Ronald was born on September 21, 1932, they moved to a home near 3100 South on Park Street. This location presented a real concern for them in that it was very near Mill Creek stream. Young Ronald was always escaping confinement in the yard and they feared he would fall into the water and drown. As soon as circumstances allowed they moved to a home at 917 Forest View Avenue which had no water hazard. The three of them became four on December 2, 1934, while they were living on Forest View Avenue, when Barbara was born into the family. In late 1935 or early 1936 they moved to 1057 Norris Place. By this time, Victor was working as an upholstery cleaner for Western Pontiac used car lots. About a year later, he obtained employment at Owen Wagstaff's Wasatch Oil Service Station at 21st South and Main, and they moved to 49 East Redondo Avenue. While living there, Victor decided he had to learn a trade to find more rewarding employment. He enrolled in a correspondence course in Refrigeration and Air Conditioning and while completing this course, moved again into the basement of his father's home on 33rd South. After graduating from refrigeration school in 1938, he could not find a job in refrigeration, but was able to find a better job as a shipping clerk at the Paris Company department store on Broadway in Salt Lake City. Then, during the summer of 1939 he built the first home that he and Bertha owned at 4265 South 9th East in Murray where they were living when Karen was born on December 14, 1940 at the old Cottonwood Maternity Hospital in Murray. In August of 1941 he decided to take advantage of an employment opportunity in Southern California, so renting the home on 9th East, he and the family moved to 1832-1/2 Orchard Avenue in Los Angeles, while he worked as an aluminum hand straightener for Aluminum Company of America at Vernon, California. In December 1941 they moved to 611 South Pacific Avenue in Glendale, California where he obtained training as a machinist and went to work for Fray Machine Tool Company in Glendale. However, the family was not happy in southern California, and that fact along with some concerns relative to World War II, prompted him to return to Utah. In March, 1943 he and the family returned from California

and moved back into their home on 9th East in Murray. He was finally able to apply his training as a refrigeration mechanic working for Pacific Intermountain Express. In 1946, he added about double the floor space to the home and added a garage and fruit storage cellar doing the work himself with help from Bertha and his son Ron. Victor's last-born, Eldon, was born in Murray during this period on January 21, 1947. When P.I.E. shut down their refrigeration service facility in Salt Lake, Victor stayed with them as a diesel mechanic, while doing refrigeration work on the side in his own business for a few years until he again found a job in refrigeration with the Louis Roser Company. But after a few years, union problems forced him to find other employment. He joined Granite School District in 1955 as head custodian at Madison Elementary School and then as the first head custodian at Millcreek Elementary School in 1956. When he was appointed to the Millcreek Elementary position, after more than thirteen years at one address, he moved from 4265 South 9th East to 1195 Cutler Road so he could walk to work. When Granite School District opened their new district offices on 3rd East in 1960, Victor was appointed head custodian and building engineer at that building. He remained there until his retirement in July of 1975.

With all the heartache and disruptions during his lifetime caused by moving from place to place, changing employment, worrying about making ends meet, and so forth, it was in 1966 that Victor reached the deepest depths of despair during his life. Bertha had had health problems for several years. In 1966 she required the removal of a kidney stone. During surgery, it was determined that one kidney was beyond repair and was removed. A stone was removed from the other, but she did not respond as expected and after about a week in Cottonwood Hospital in Murray, Utah she passed away on July 9, 1966. Victor was heartbroken, and found many aspects of his life had changed. Their marriage had been a sharing and cooperative life together, and he now had many responsibilities placed upon him that had been handled by Bertha, and for which he had little first-hand experience. Karen was handicapped, and Eldon was still living at home. He had all the normal homemaking responsibilities to do alone, and that is just how he felt...alone. Ron and Barbara tried to involve him in their family activities and although it provided welcome company, it was not the same as having Bertha by his side. Then, just a couple of months later, on September 18, 1966 his mother passed away. In the short space of 10 weeks, the two most important and loved women in his life were taken from him.

But, in February, 1968, he became acquainted with one of the secretaries at the Granite School District office. She had been widowed in May of 1965 and the two of them started dating. They dated all summer. She introduced him to the sport of golf for which he developed a strong affection. They golfed together, went out to dinner and to stage shows which they both enjoyed, and then on November 8, 1968, they were married in the Salt Lake

Temple by Elder LeGrand Richards for "time only". When he married Lucille, Victor sold his home on Cutler Road and moved into her home at 2740 Grandview Circle. The two of them liked to travel. They honeymooned in the Hawaiian Islands. They took trips aboard cruise ships on the Carribean and through the Panama Canal. And, in August of 1986 Vic and Lucille accompanied Ron and his wife Gladys, on a two week trip to Switzerland. He really enjoyed seeing the area around Faulensee where his mother had been born and raised, where his grandfather Andreas Burgener had lived before emigrating to America, and where his father had served his mission. He talked with some of the natives who share the Burgener name in the area of Zermatt and who bear an uncanny resemblance to members of the Burgener family here. He conversed with a couple named Gertsch who operated a souvenir shop in Interlaken; Gertsch being the family name of his father's missionary companion and husband of his mother's sister, Elise Durtschi. He enjoyed the quiet serenity of Krattigen, the birthplace of his grandmother Magdalena Meier Burgener. His hotel was located in Krattigen with a balcony overlooking Lake Thun and the lovely and picturesque village of Faulensee, the hometown of his forebears for generations. Of all the trips and traveling they had done, both Victor and Lucille agreed that their trip to Switzerland was the most memorable.

Victor held many positions of responsibility in various wards and stakes throughout his lifetime. He served as a Sunday School Teacher, Ward Financial Clerk, Stake Ward Teaching Secretary, Teacher's Quorum Adviser, Ward Clerk twice, Assistant Ward Clerk, High Priest Group Leader twice, Stake High Priest Secretary, Teacher Trainer, and Adult Aaronic Instructor. Six months after his retirement, Victor was called as an ordinance worker in the Salt Lake Temple. He was very concerned about his ability to perform the ordinances and administration of the endowment since he had trouble memorizing. He prayed sincerely for assistance in this respect and when he was set apart on January 20, 1976 he was blessed that he would have the ability to perform the duties of the calling as required. He never had any problems from then on. He was able to apply himself heart and soul to the work and has indicated this calling to be the best calling that he has ever had in the Church. He served over twelve years, with a couple of brief periods off for health reasons, until being released on April 19, 1988.

The year 1981 was not one that Victor would consider one of his best. In October, Lucille was hospitalized with a low blood count and bleeding ulcers for almost two weeks. During this time, Victor was picking apples at what he referred to as "the farm", his father's old home on 33rd South. He failed to set the ladder on which he was working on a firm footing, and as a result, the ladder slipped and he fell about five feet, landing on his back on top of the ladder smashing it. When he went to visit Lucille in the hospital that day, she could see that he was

in great pain and insisted that he go to the emergency room to be checked. X-Rays showed that he had smashed a vertebra in the middle of his back and shortened his stature a small amount. He suffered pain for some time, and never really was able to return to full strength, experiencing occasional back spasms from then on. Almost a year later on September 14, 1982, following an eye examination by Dr. Andrew Lyle he found he had cataracts in both eyes. Lucille was scheduled for surgery in October to receive an artificial knee, so she wanted Vic to have his eyes operated on before then. Although booked well beyond the date of her surgery, someone cancelled their eye surgery and Vic had the cataract removed and an implant sewn in the next day on September 15, 1982. It took 30 minutes for the operation and he had to apply eye drops four times a day for three weeks and wear protection at night, but it improved his vision to a point better than he had been able to see for several years.

Victor took another fall on November 29, 1986. This time he fell down the basement steps, which were unusually steep, and crashed into the wall at the bottom of the steps with his shoulder, leaving a large hole in the sheetrock. He couldn't move without severe pain. Lucille called his brother Albert who came and carried him up the steps and took him to St. Marks Hospital where he remained for four days with multiple broken ribs, a punctured lung, and a severely damaged shoulder. He stayed home for two months then returned to his duties at the Temple. After this fall he was never able to fully raise his right arm to the square without pain. This marked the beginning of the end for both his golf game and his Temple service.

Lucille's health started to deteriorate and due to medications she was required to take for arthritis, ulcers, and blood problems, her eyesight began to fail in 1987. It was to provide assistance and support to her that Victor was released from his Temple calling in April of 1988, although his own health problems resulting from his fall in 1986 was also a contributing factor. Her health continued to decline. She was finally admitted to LDS Hospital in an effort to build her blood and strengthen her, but she passed away on August 29, 1990. Victor was again alone. Victor missed Lucille as much as he had missed Bertha. Again, he was required to assume duties which he had not done for many years. From that time on, he felt his life was as complete as it needed to be and that he should be with his loved ones on the other side. Still, he continued to lead a somewhat active, albeit subdued lifestyle. He continued to grow a garden and care for the yard. He made minor repairs to the home on Grandview Circle and remained active in the ward, but it was evident, all was not as it had been in the past.

Finally, his children, fearing another fall down the basement steps convinced him that the best thing for him to do would be to

move to an independent living center where he could still come and go as he pleased and continue to take care of himself, but where maintenance and repairs, and heavy meal preparation would be a thing of the past. There he could develop friendships with people in circumstances similar to his that would help to take his mind off the problems on which he seemed to dwell. So it was that on December 4, 1993 he left 2740 Grandview Circle after 25 years and settled in at Highland Cove Independent Living Center on Highland Drive. By now he was experiencing periods of short-term memory loss, but he continued to look after his own affairs. He made friends and enjoyed a Christmas and New Years Eve party with fond memories of fun and activity. Then on January 4, 1994, he decided to walk down to St. Marks Hospital, about half a mile away, to question a doctor about a physical he had completed. On his way back, while crossing the hospital parking lot he lost his balance and fell. This time he damaged his right shoulder again and took a severe blow on the forehead which broke a small spur on the second vertebra at the top of the spine. This put him in the hospital for the last time. With his desire to be with his loved ones on the other side, and unwilling to accept "heroic" means of sustaining life, he passed quietly through the veil a few minutes after noon on January 15, 1994.

Victor's life spanned a period when some of the greatest technological changes man has ever seen took place upon this earth. He lived from the time when the standard mode of transportation was by horse and buggy through the advent of radio and television and almost twenty five years past the time that man walked on the moon. He was a man who worked hard, was naturally frugal, but never hesitated to give of himself to others he considered less able to do for themselves. He learned as a youth on the farm that it was not easy to buy new things simply because old ones had broken. Out of necessity and decades before recycling became a watchword of society he learned to recycle by repairing and refurbishing the old rather than replacing it with the new. He was truly a jack-of-all-trades, and a man of wisdom, planning and good example.
