accident of General George H. Gates of Revolutionary fame. Mr. Rose was married to Mary Ann McBride, June 12, 1865 in St. Peter's church, New York City. To this union were born thirteen children of which six survive as follows: William J. Rose, steward of the Elks Club and Mrs. J. R. Harbottle, of this city; James J., somewhere in Mexico; Patrick, a prominent and wealthy mining man of Globe, Ariz.; Thomas, of Los Angeles and Dan of San Diego. Twelve grandchildren and two great-grandchildren also survive him. Mrs. Rose died March 17, 1913. Daddy Rose and family came to Silver City overlaid in 1876 from Camp Lowell, Tucson, Ariz., where he received his honorable discharge from the army and this place has been his home ever since. He participated in all the early Indian battles in this section, helping in the capture of Mangas Colorado, and other bad Indians. He was absolutely fearless and this is why he probably held the position of jail guard so long, serving under Sheriffs, Whitehill, Lockhart, Laird, Woods and Blair. He was probably the only living white man who was in Santa Rita in 1832 when the copper mines were being worked under great difficulties owing to the attacks of the Indians. This was twenty years before Silver City was founded and at that time it is to be doubted if there were 100 American families in this entire section. That same year Grant county was given that strip along her southern border known as part of the Gadsden Purchase. His familiar figure and hearty greeting will be sadly missed among young and old alike. He was an active figure on the streets ruin or shine up to within a few weeks of his death. He lived to a ripe old age a life of activity and now he passes to his well earned rest.

Mohair Case Passed Upon by Higher Court
A decision was rendered by the State Supreme court last Monday in Santa Fe in the case of the American National Bank of this city vs. E. J. Wood and Elizabeth De Moos appealed from Grant county, in which the judgment of the lower court was affirmed as to Wood and reversed as to De Moos. This action was brought in the district court for Grant county by the American National bank of Silver City, New Mexico, against Wood and De Moos, partners, doing business under the firm name of Wood and De Moos. The action was for damages for breach of contract to deliver Angora mohair. From a judgment rendered against E. J. Wood and Elizabeth De Moos, the appellants perfected this appeal. Syllabus by the Court 1. Evidence of joint ownership in property is not sufficient in itself to prove partnership. Evidence examined and held insufficient to hold partner liable as partners in act. 2. To charge one as a partner he
