AGED LADY PASSES AWAY

Mrs. Mary Slater, Long a Resident Here, Dies Yesterday.

In the death yesterday morning of Mrs. Mary Slater Allen county loses one of her pioneer residents a woman who had made her life-long residence in Allen county and Huntington. Mrs. Slater died Wednesday morning at the home of her son, Horace W. Slater, of Loud.

The deceased was born in Clinton county, Ohio, April 10, 1838, and came to this county in the year of 1884 and in this district made her home until her demise yesterday. She is survived by two daughters Mrs. Elizabeth Robertson, Fort Wayne, Mrs. Laura Hranstratz, Clarksville, O., and Horace W. Slater, of Loud. Ten grandchildren and ten great grandchildren also survive.

Funeral services will be held Friday morning at 10 o'clock at Washington Center, three miles west of Loud.

Mrs. Caroline Osterholt passed away this morning at 7:30 at her home at 1214 Gay street. The deceased was 92 years old and death was due to an accident that took place some months ago resulting in complications that proved fatal. Mrs. Osterholt was born in Germany Aug. 26, 1836, and came to this country when she was a young girl. Twenty-seven years ago her husband preceded her in death, his funeral being the first one held in the Zion Lo-
