

Catholic Priest Lauded at Requiem Mass

Tribute for many years of faithful and loyal service in the Intermountain West was paid The Rev. Edward Cassidy, 50, at solemn requiem high mass Saturday morning in Cathedral of the Madeleine, 331 E. South Temple.

Father Cassidy, Evanston, Wyo., died Wednesday in a Salt Lake hospital. He had been pastor of St. Mary Magdalen Parish in Evanston more than 20 years.

Rt. Rev. Msgr. Robert J. Dwyer, rector of the Cathedral of the Madeleine, delivered the sermon. He said Father Cassidy was a person well known and loved in Salt Lake City for his years of service to people of the west.

Rt. Rev. Msgr. Patrick F. Kennedy, pastor of St. Joseph's Catholic Parish, Ogden, was celebrant at the mass. The Rev. Martin Burke, pastor of St. Vincent De Paul Parish, Murray, was deacon and the Rev. Francis J. Sloan, pastor of St. Therese Parish, Midvale, was subdeacon.
