Martha McKinney, born January 17, 1847 at Winter Quarters, Nebraska. Died: January 17, 1928. Was buried at Lewiston, Cache County, Utah. Married to Hyrum Karren.
Peninna McCaslin, born April 3, 1849 at Salt Lake City, Utah. Died: February 28 or 27, 1871. Was buried at Salt Lake City, Utah. Married to James V. Allen.

George W. Langley is the son of Rev. John Langley who was a Captain in the Revolutionary war, and although a Reverend, was always afterward called Captain Langley. He died on his 90th birthday during a trip to Mill, probably on horseback. His wife's maiden name is not known.

George W. Langley married Mary Turner about 1842. She was born November 26, 1826 in Indiana. Their children are Elsie, born about 1844; Mary born about 1846, and George born about 1848.

George W. Langley and his wife Mary were endowed at the Nauvoo Temple on the 17th of December 1845. On January 20, 1846 at Nauvoo Temple, he was married to Mrs. Martha McKinney Frost Akes - prob. by Heber C. Kimball. He was also sealed the same day to his wife Mary.

He did missionary work in Memphis, Tenn. Was Brigham Young's body guard - also Heber C. Kimball's. Was Captain of Police at Nauvoo, standing guard at Nauvoo Temple. Was Captain of the First Company of Mormons who crossed the Mississippi River on the ice at the time they were driven from Nauvoo City by the mob in February 1846. July 7, 1846 President Brigham Young and others addressed a meeting at Mt. Pisgah on the subject of raising a battalion to march to California. 66 men volunteered. George W. Langley was sent by them to Garden Grove to the Presiding Bishop or Elder with a letter on the same subject, asking them to get volunteers for the Mormon Battalion.

The Langleys moved to Winter Quarters where Martha M. Langley was born January 17, 1847. They came to Utah in the Heber C. Kimball Company. Arrived at Salt Lake City September 25, 1848. George W. Langley built the first adobe house in Salt Lake City. His death was caused from exposure suffered while on guard duty. He was the first man buried in the Salt Lake City Cemetery. He died February 24, 1850 or 1849.
