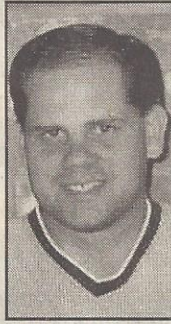


## Wm. Scott Hoggan
