

DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

Act Approved September 8, 1916.

This paper may be executed before a Notary Public, a Justice of the Peace, or any other officer authorized by law to administer oaths for general purposes. The Certificate of the Prothonotary or Clerk of the Court need NOT be attached hereto but will be procured, if at all, when called for by the Commissioner of Pensions.

STATE OF Illinois COUNTY OF Cook SS:

On the date hereinbefore mentioned, personally appeared before me, a Notary Public within and for the County and State aforesaid Elizabeth H. Whitson aged 61 years, a resident

of the City of Chicago County of Cook State of Illinois who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of David G. Whitson who enlisted under the name of David G. Whitson Name of deceased Soldier or Seaman.

David G. Whitson at C. S. 76th Ill Vols on the day of A. D., 1....., in and served at least Here state rank, company, and regiment, if in the military service; or vessel if in the Navy.

Ninety days in the late war of the Rebellion, who was HONORABLY DISCHARGED and died

Nov. 18, 1901 at Manhattan, Will. County, Ill. State date of death. The cause of death need not be stated. State place of death.

That she was married under the name of Elizabeth H. Price to said David G. Whitson Name before marriage. Name of deceased Soldier or Sailor.

on the 29th day of May 1900, by Rev. C. R. Betts at Englewood, Chicago, Ill. there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that she had once been previously married; that he had once been previously married. She was married to Alexander Price, who died March 1, 1879, in Homer, Russell County, Kansas. He was married to Mary Ann Etter, who died in Manhattan, Ill. about the year 1883. She was born Sept. 24, 1854 in Wallingford, Ill.

If there was a former marriage of claimant or her husband state it here and how dissolved.

That she was not divorced from him and has not remarried since the death of the said David G. Whitson Name of Soldier or Seaman.

That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States under the provision of the Act Approved Sept. 8, 1916.

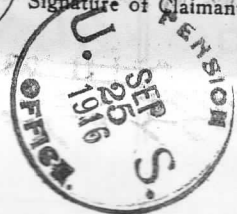
