What is Being Done in the Clerk's Office.

In the office of the county clerk yesterday John G. Fleming, John J. Engelberts, Ben D. Spencer and Edward C. Stimson filed their certificate that they compose the majority of the directors of the Woody Consolidated Mining and Milling company, and that the capital stock is 2,000,000 shares at a par value of \$1 each. They further certify that the stock has all been sold and the proceeds applied to the purchase of the Minnie S, Shady Side, Mocking Bird, Sunny South and Southern Girl lode mining claims, in the Woody district.

M. L. Rush by his mining deed, conveys to C. A. Robertson, a one-fourth interest in the Homestake lode mining claim at the head of Difficulty creek in Pitkin county.

Location certificates were filed by B. J. Neeley, Thomas Carey, Frank Carey, Fred Neeley and Thomas Casoy for the Weaver, More Silver, Chateauguy, Columbine, Pride of Ashcroft and Nashua lode mining claims in the Columbia district.

W. P. Green filed his affidavit of assessment for the Spar lode mining claim in the Columbia district.

Frank A. Pierson filed for record a ditch statement of the Pierson ditch on Willow creek. The statement shows that the ditch is two feet wide on the bottom and three feet wide at high water mark. Its capacity is 11,295 feet per second of time.
