

Washoe Assembly Candidate Applies For Navy Service

Walter S. Baring of Reno is one candidate for election this fall who isn't going to conduct a campaign and cares little whether he is elected.

Baring has enlisted in the United States navy as a radio technician, and is awaiting his call for active service.

He enlisted in the navy after the primary campaign, in which he was one of the six Democratic party nominees for the assembly from Washoe county. Under Nevada law, he cannot withdraw from the election.

Should he be elected as an assemblyman in the general election, at he will have to resign. He served the assembly in 1937 from this county. Later he was a United States senate attache, and recently has been operating a furniture store here.

Bivouac in Mountains Completes Training for CAP Mounted Group

Twenty-five members of the mounted command, Civil Air Patrol, completed their basic training courses this weekend with an overnight bivouac near the head of Thomas Creek.

They mapped the trails across the Sierra to Hunter Lake on the trip home.

The overnight bivouac is the final training directive in the basic training schedule for the mounted units. Under its regulations, all food, supplies, field equipment, radio, crash equipment and food for horses must be transported by

saddle or pack horse. Mounted sentries, picket lines, field kitchens and regulation cavalry procedure must be used.

In covering exceptionally rough terrain, at an altitude between 7600 and 8000 feet, mounted units called upon air intelligence for maps. Squadron 961-1, based at Reno prepared an aerial strip photo map of the entire route, which was used by the mounted units on the maneuver.

So thoroughly was all staff work prepared for the trip that at no time was the column more than 10 minutes off schedule. All troopers made the trip in good shape.
