DEATH OF COL BOYLE

Well Known Pioneer Succumbs to Pneumonia at Dayton

Word reached this city Sunday that Colonel Boyle had died in Dayton.

His condition was known to as serious but it was the hope of the many friends in this city that he would survive. The general expression upon the receipt of the news was one of sorrow, as the Colonel was not only well known but was a favorite in this community. His death is regarded as a great loss to the community as he was a very active man and had many enterprises on hand that would work to the benefit of the community.

Colonel Boyle, was a native of the County Donegal, Ireland. He came to the Pacific coast in 1854 and arrived on the Comstock in 1868 where he first came into prominence as foreman of the Justice mine. Later he succeeded to the superintendency of the Alta, Lady Washington and Keystone in Gold Hill, which positions he held until work was suspended on the properties a few years ago. Latterly he had been engaged in developing the North Rapidan mine at Como, of which he was one of the principal owners and which property he was confident of soon placing on a paying basis.

He represented Storey county in the State senate in the sessions of 1887 and 1889. In the early eighties while superintendent of the Alta, 7 men were entombed for eight hours on the 2150 lever through a break in the pumping machinery and their rescue alive was due to the prompt measures adopted by Colonel Boyle, who never slept until their rescue was effecter. In his death Nevada loses one of its most worthy and popular citizens. He leaves a widow, two sons and three brothers.

The remains will be shipped from Dayton over the Carson & Colorado to Mound House today from where they will be reshipped to San Francisco, accompanied by Mrs. Boyle, her two sons, Manasseh Boyle, a brother of deceased and M. F. Boyle, a relative.
