

## EDWARD D. BOYLE

- Born in Ireland in 1836
- Moved with family to Pennsylvania in 1843
- Died February 9, 1902, in Dayton, Nevada
- Member of the Nevada Legislature for 12 years, all of which were in the Senate
- A Republican
- Represented Storey County
- Senate Member, 1885-1896

Chairman of a number of important Senate standing committees during this period, including the Committees on Corporations and Railroads, Mines and Mining, and Military and Indian Affairs

- A Lieutenant Colonel in the Nevada Militia
- Edward D. Boyle spent his working years in the mining industry, moving to Nevada's Comstock from California in 1863. Over the years, he worked as the superintendent of various mines in Virginia City, Gold Hill, and Como.
- Senator Boyle and his wife had a daughter, Edna, and two sons, Emmet and Alexander. Emmet D. Boyle served with distinction as Governor of Nevada from 1915 through 1922.
