Eva May Pausche nee Nixon, of Sorrento, passed away to be with her Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ on August 31st, 2009 following a long battle with metastasized breast cancer.

She was born to parents Minnie Hammond and Thomas Nixon on December 28th, 1921 in Ponoka, Alberta. She moved from Burnaby, B.C. to Sorrento in the fall of 1978, 7 years following the death of her husband of 29 years, William John Pausche.



Eva was a blessing and an inspiration to others. She fell in love with the Shuswap area, Cedar Heights in particular, after visiting in 1977 with her late brother, Al Nixon.
