Former state legislator dies

LOGANDALE, Nev. — Former state legislator Vernon E. Bunker, an early supporter of civil rights legislation who did farm chores and worked in government well into his 80s, died Thursday at home.

Family members said Bunker, 89, recently had been diagnosed with cancer. He is survived by his wife, Earline, and two sons and two daughters.

A funeral service is scheduled here Thursday at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

A Democrat, Bunker served in the Assembly from 1959 to 1966. In 1965, he introduced the civil rights bill that led to the law requiring equal access to accommodations.

Bunker also served in the Senate between 1967 and 1970, and returned in 1979 to work as the upper house sergeant-at-arms. In 1991 he was named to the Senate hall of fame.

"He was always a very courageous-type individual," said Sen. Joe Neal, D-North Las Vegas.

"When there was a district-at-large (for Clark County) he always came to the black community. He essentially represented the black community."

Neal said black leaders asked Bunker to sponsor fair housing legislation, which he subsequently pushed into law.

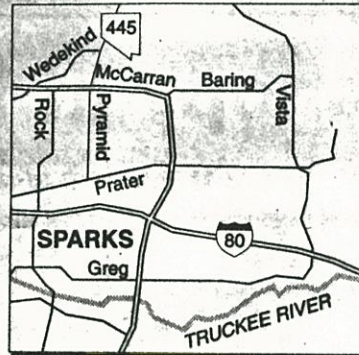
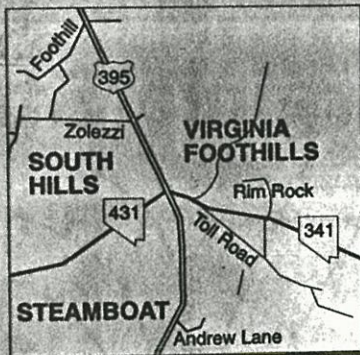
