

WELL KNOWN RESIDENT OF KANARRA DIES IN CEDAR HOSPITAL

Mrs. Harriet L. Stapley, 80, life-long resident of Kanarra, died at the Iron county hospital Wednesday afternoon of pneumonia and complications, after a serious illness of a week. She had been in poor health since November, but was taken seriously ill only last Thursday.

Mrs. Stapley was born in Kanarra on November 17, 1867, a daughter of William Shanks and Rebecca Rosena Beck Berry, and had lived there all her life except for a short period during which she lived in Wayne county. Always active in church affairs, she had held offices in the Ward Primary, Relief Society and Sunday School organizations.

On February 21, 1888, she married James S. Stapley in the St. George L D S temple. Mr. Stapley died in March, 1926.

Funeral services will be conducted in the Kanarra ward chapel at 2 p. m. Saturday by Bishop Lorenzo Williams. Friends may view the body at the Jensen Mortuary in Cedar City Friday afternoon and evening, or they may call at the Stapley home Saturday morning.

Mrs. Stapley is survived by three sons, William B. Stapley, Provo; James Parley Stapley, Midvale; Dee S. Stapley, Beaver; one daughter, Mrs. P. J. Williams, Cedar City, eighteen grandchildren and eleven great-grandchildren. Also surviving are three sisters Mrs. Mina Platt, Kanarra; Mrs. Wm. H. Leigh, Cedar City, and Mrs. Ed.
