—Mr. Alois Gehrig, of Cohocton, died in that village Sept. 1st, 1879, aged 74 years. Mr. G. came to this country in 1847, bringing a family. He lived in Rochester and Dansville, and came to Cohocton in 1856, retiring to his farm in 1872. The deceased had many warm friends in Rochester, Dansville, Perkinsville, and Cohocton, who attested their respect for him by the large attendance at the last tribute to his memory, the services of which were conducted by Rev. Father Fanger, at the Catholic church in Cohocton. He was known as a quiet, unassuming, inoffensive, good citizen. He was one of the four original founders of the Catholic Church at Liberty, and has been one of the foremost members of the society. The church will miss him greatly.
