Mr. Richard Case, a well known resident of this place died at the home of his son, Ed Case, Tuesday evening, November 26, 1912 at the age of 78 years 9 months and 10 days. Heart failure is given as the cause of his death. He was born in Mercer county KY, February 16, 1834. He was married to Mary F. Long, January 8, 1857. To this union eight children were born, five sons, Ed, Wm, Lew, Ernest and one son in the west whose name we did not learn and three daughters, none of whom live in this community. His wife preceeded him in death November 23, 1901. Funeral services were held at the Christian church Thursday at eleven o'clock by Elder Harris of Brashear after which the remains were interred in the Lewistown cemetery. Thus another has passed into the great beyond, reminding us that life is uncertain and that we, too, must grapple with death and that death will be a certain victor and that our own safety is to give ourselves to him who does all things well.

NEWSPAPER CLIPPING:

IN MEMORY OF FATHER In loving remembrance of our dear father, (Richard Case) who departed this life at the home of his son in Lewistown, where he has made his home since the death of our dear mother. He was born in Mercer county, Kentucky, February 16, 1834, and died November 26, 1912, aged 78 years, 9 months and 10 days. He was married to Mary F. Long, January 8, 1857. To this union were born eight children, five boys and three girls, all living. He lived an honest and industrious life until God said, "It is enough, come up higher." For a few weeks he was complaining more than usual, but he bore his suffering without a murmur. Although he was feeble, the affliction was not a burden to him; he was cheerful and thoughtful of our comfort, even after his body became frail and delicate. For some time before his death he realized his work on earth was drawing to a close. He often told us to bear up and be of good cheer for his sake. Death had no terror for our father; he suffered so much it seemed a happy change. He has joined the loved ones who have gone before. May God help us to live so we will be reunited in heaven.
