BELOVED MATRON CELEBRATES 87th BIRTHDAY

Mrs. Albertina Fisher, beloved Meadow matron, celebrated her 87th birthday March 4, 1954, by going to the Manti Temple and spending the day. Mr. and Mrs. F. Earl Stott took her over. Mr. and Mrs. A. J. T. Sorensen and Mrs. Rachel Bennett went with them.

Mrs. Fisher, or "Aunt Teen" as she is affectionately known by everyone in Meadow, was born March 4, 1867 at the Old Fort in Deseret.

She came to Meadow when two years of age and has lived here all of her life, with the exception of one year in Colorado and three years in Salt Lake City.

She was married to Joseph H. Fisher in the Endowment House in Salt Lake City Dec. 6, 1883. He passed away November 21, 1940.

Aunt Teen has been an active worker in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints since 1881 when she was chosen as the first secretary in the Y.W.M.I.A. She has also served as president, and then as counselor to four different presidents.

She served as counselor to Pres. Susannah Robison in the Stake Mutual for nine years. This was before the Stake was divided and Millard Stake included all of Millard County. Their mode of travel was by horse and buggy, so Sister Robison and her Counselors, Mary Badger and Albertina Fisher, spent many happy days visiting each town in the Stake, which required a period of two weeks each year.

Some of her other Church activities include teaching in the Sunday School for thirty-one years, and serving as President of the Relief Society for five years.

From 1925 to 1930 Mrs. Fisher and her husband, Joseph H. Fisher, spent a very enjoyable five years as missionaries at the Manti Temple.

After a long life of activity, she still enjoys going to Church each Sunday, and to Relief Society meeting each Tuesday.

She has a wonderful memory and is very interested in world affairs, which she keeps in touch with through the Deseret News and radio.

Mrs. Fisher, her daughter Ida and son-in-law, F. Earl Stott, live together at Meadow.

Her son Asael and wife Flora live in Provo where they are still active in school teaching and Church work.
