O. H. Grey, the Republican nominee for Secretary of State was born on the 1st day of 1835; received a common school and academical education in the highlands of the Hudson. Before reaching his majority he removed to Warren county Illinois, where he

spent six years teaching school winters and farming summers. He removed to California in 1859, taking the overland route, where he engaged in mining and merchandising until 1863, when he removed to Storey county, Nevada, and for six years was engaged in the lumber business and mining. In March, 1869, he removed to White Pine county, where he has since been, mostly engaged in merchandising. In 1884 he was admitted to the Bar. In 1865 he was elected a member of the Assembly from Storey county, and in 1866 was returned to the State Senate from that county, and took an active part in the memorable struggle of the late Mr. De Long for a seat in the United States Senate. He has been thrice returned to the Assembly from White Pine county, and was each time chosen Speaker pro tem of that body. He was one of the standard bearers of the Republican party in the Garfield campaign, the only time he failed to tally a majority. He was married in 1881 to Miss G. G. Collins, daughter of the late Dr. Collins of Dayton, Nevada, and has one son; is fifty-five years old in vigorous health. He has been actively engaged in politics since the organization of the Republican party, and has never been tainted with mugwumpery.
