Mr. Poujade was born of American parents near Salem, Or., in 1852. His youth was spent in that State, Washington, Idaho and California. In 1873 he went to Pioche, Nev., and has resided there ever since, with the exception of two years—1875-6—spent in the East. He has been engaged in merchandising and mining until two years ago, when the former occupation was dropped. He was admitted to the Bar in 1888, and is now prac-

tiating law. In 1884 he was elected to represent Lincoln county in the State Senate, and served during the sessions of 1885 and 1887. During his latter term he was President pro tem. of that body. In 1888 he was elected to the Assembly, and served during the last session with credit to himself and honor to his county. He has always been a Republican, yet he has been elected to serve a Democratic constituency twice in the State Legislature.
