	9-11	After Hauns Mill Massacre, Joseph Smith was betrayed into the hands of the militia or mob and Moses and others were obliged to lay down their arms, were overpowered and persecuted, were robbed, had property plundered, and were forced to sign away their property. Were then shut up in confinement, and the next day driven to Richmond and thrust into prison with the Prophet. After several days a trial commenced and many were liberated. The Prophet was taken to Liberty and thrust into Prison with a few others	Far West
