Estella and Frank Cord (1st marriage) were divorced. Her daughter Olive Cord was raised by Frank and his 2nd wife in Canada.

Estella was a maid in the Eccles home in Logan, when she met Wells Alonzo Whitney who had been married to her sister Effie. Effie had died leaving Wells with her child Arnold Clyde. Estella then married Wells.

Estella was 5' 11" tall. She weighed 175-180, and had grey eyes, with dark brown hair.

Olive was a Primary officer in Northern States Mission. She also help Primary in her home in Butte, Montana.

Estella's special interests were her family. She delighted in setting a good table. Her son Floyd remembers that she had many crocheted items in her home. He still has the little hat she crocheted for him when he was an infant.

During her short stay on earth, she had homes in Fielding, Box Elder Co., Brigham, Ogden, Weber Co, Logan, Smithfield and Cormish, all of Cache Co., Pocatello, American Falls, and Weston, Utah. Also lived in Butte, Montana and worked in Burbank, California where she died.

Besides suffering with goiter in her latter years, she had rickets and shingles. She then died of Typhoid at the early age of 41 years old. She passed away Fri morning, 6 April 1934 in Burbank where she had been working the past 1 1/2 years.

Surviving her were here husband Wells, her parents, 3 daughters and 1 son.
