The South Carolina Gazette, 1751-1753.¹● No. 913, November 13th, 1751, back page:

Just arrived in the Ship Anne Capt. Charles Kennaway, now lying off Mr. Bedon's Wharf, About 200 GERMAN Passengers, Amongst them are several handicraft Tradesmen and Husbandmen, and likely young Boys and Girls. They are to be indented for a Term of Years, to any Person who will pay their Passages. Apply to Austin & Laurens

● No. 973, February 5, 1753:

Vessells Entering inwards Charlestown, Ship Elizabeth, John Ross, from Rotterdam & Portsmouth.

● No. 974, February 12th, 1753:

The Ship Elizabeth, Captain John Ross, just arrived with GERMAN SERVANTS in good health, Amongst them are tradesmen of all sorts, which will be indented on reasonable Terms, JOHN McCALL
